

## **6.MBA (after 16 Years of Non Business Education)**

Master in Business Administration (MBA) program is two years degree program, with a requirement of 60-66 credit hours and will span over four regular semesters. This master degree program aimed to inculcate managerial and leadership skills and to prepare business graduates for both national as well as multinational organizations.

### **Program Objectives**

1. To upgrade the business knowledge and managerial decision-making abilities of the students
2. To sharpen analytical skills so that they can analyze firms' quantifiable numerical data and make intelligent and effective strategic decisions.
3. To develop leadership abilities, entrepreneurial skills and promote creative thinking so that they can establish new ventures.
4. To provide exposure to the students to take research thesis in the areas of finance, management and marketing

### **Eligibility/Admission Criteria:**

1. For admission in MBA Program, a candidate has to appear in an Admission Entry test to be conducted by the committee proposed by the Director IMS and approved by the Vice Chancellor. However, the test results will be only on PASS/FAIL basis with 50% passing marks.
2. The candidate is required to have at least CGPA of 2.2/4 or 53% Marks in semester system or 45% marks in annual system.
3. The candidate must have 16 Years of undergraduate Education or old Master degree like MA or MSc or equivalent degree from HEC recognized institution.

### **Degree Requirements**

The following are the essential requirements for the degree of MBA:

1. Successful completion of 20 (each of 3 credit hours) MBA courses individually, or Successful completion of 18 MBA courses along with Research Project of 6 credit hours in lieu of two elective courses.
2. Maintaining a minimum cumulative grade point average of 2.0 in all semesters and attaining a minimum CGPA of 2.2 at the end of 4th semester.
3. Successful completion of 6-8 weeks internship
4. Successful completion of Comprehensive Examination (evaluation shall be made on the basis of Pass/Fail. There shall be no grading or marks for comprehensive examination.
